# Celebrating 100 Years of S.u.G.E.D. "Washingtonia" A Brief History

**1923** 



In the dim years following World War 1, Michael Benekidt emigrated to Washington, D.C., found it to his liking, and invited his brother and friends from Trachtenverein Kirchstoaner in Bad Tölz to join him. In 1923 George Seidl, Lorenz Benedikt and Hans Sedlmaier arrived and were joined by "Old Country" friends Lorenz and Matthias Kerschbaum, and Fred Meister. Among their first public appearances was a performance for the benefit of the Relief for German and Austrian Children held at the old Concord Hall. Soon they were joined by young ladies, most of them Austrian, including Ema Ulrich, and from 1923 until 1932 the Schuhplattler were to be found at many social benefit events.

In 1932 Frank Korber, who had gone to Philadelphia from Germany seven years earlier, moved to town to rejoin his old friends. His brother George, remained in Philadelphia, a member of G.T.V. "Almrausch". The two clubs met occasionally in Baltimore for dancing and high jinks.

The Schuhplattler Club Edelweiss (as they were known then) held its first Bauernball in the Knights of Columbus Hall on January 7, 1933. In July 1934 the dancers delighted a gathering of over two thousand Washingtonians at Walsh Grove with their art. During a Depression Era show, Mrs. Eleanor Roosevelt spontaneously rose and shook hands with each one of the performers.

As with most German organizations, World War II brought the group's activities to a standstill, until October 1946, when Max Blob, owner of Jessup, Maryland's Bavarian Biergarten gathered the Schuhplattler once again.



In 1958, the group was formally incorporated under its present name of Schuhplattler und Gebirgstrachten Verein "Washingtonia". Lorenz Benedikt was elected its first honorary president.

The first Grand Heimatabend was held in November 1959. During this event all 5 original members from Bad Tölz were elected honorary members.

Active in the Washington area's German community, the Verein was instrumental as a founding member of the Association of German-American Societies of Greater Washington (AGAS) and also fully supported the Concord Club and the Washington Sängerbund in their various endeavors. Many group members held memberships in some or all of these organizations.

In September of 1961, the group carried the banner of the District of Columbia in the Munich Oktoberfest Parade.





held its Fahnenweihe and 40. Stiftungsfest, which was attended by many of the old-time Vereine, dignitaries from the German embassy and DC government at the Presidential Arms Ballroom Washington, DC.

In November, 1963 the group

G.T.V. "Almrausch" Philadelphia was Patenverein and Hermine Goede. owner of Bavarian Restaurant, was honored as Fahnenmutter.

In the winter of 1965 the group performed in the East Room of the White House for the President Johnson's White House staff Christmas party. Over the years, the group performed at the many country clubs and military bases around the city. Every year they entertained the crowd at the oldest and biggest Oktoberfest in the area, sponsored by the Washington Sängerbund on the grounds of the German Orphanage.



In the early 1960 Frau Hermine Goede purchased property in Sheperdstown, WV and named it the Bavarian Inn. The group performed at festivals once or twice a year and continues this tradition even today.

Gaufest

The group was actively engaged in forming the Gauverband Nordamerika and was accepted as a charter member in January, 1966. Rudy Poelsterl, the president of Washingtonia, was also elected the first president of Gauverband Nordamerika.

The group supported the Gauverband Nordamerika's activities by attending every Gaufest and most Vereines' Fahnenweihen over the years. As a Gau NA member, S.u.G.T.V "Washingtonia" were given the honor of hosting the 4. Gaufest here in Washington, D.C., in 1973. By all reports, it was a resounding success despite the five consecutive days of unrelenting rain.

In 1978 the club marched in the Munich Oktoberfest and dined with Dr. Hans Eisenmann, the Bavarian State Minister for Agriculture and Forestry in the Bauernstüberl. All members received handsome gifts from Dr. Eisenmann. He presented all the men with engraved Weiss-Blau Bierkrüge, and the women with miniature Bayerische Löwen.







In 1981 Washingtonia journeyed to Germany again to join the Musik Verein Ohmenhausen on the occasion of its 75. Stiftungsfest. It was a week-long celebration with those members and members of Pfullingen Edelweiss and Ohmenhausen Trachtenverein. Bruderverein Edelweiß Stamm joined them for a day of fun.

In 1983 the Verein journeyed to Bavaria again to spend a week as the guests of Trachtenverein Bayrischzell and to celebrate its 100<sup>th</sup> anniversary. The following week they went to Munich to join their Bruderverein Edelweiss Stamm, to celebrate its 90<sup>th</sup> anniversary. They presented both groups with Fahnenbänder and congratulatory letters from President Ronald Reagan.

Washingtonia has participated in the Munich Oktoberfest parade on 6 occasions. 10 Members marched in the parade in 2014 and it was reported that the youngest and oldest marcher both belonged to Washingtonia. In 2022 one member took one for the team, and marched in the rain when the Munich Oktoberfest reopened after the COVID-19 pandemic

## Celebrating 100 Years of S.u.G.E.D. "Washingtonia"

Founders: Michael & Lorenz Benedikt



In the aftermath of World War 1, life was difficult economically in Upper Bavaria. As a result, young Michael Benedikt felt it necessary to explore a brighter future in the United States of America. In 1923 Michael encouraged his brother Lorenz "Lenz" and their friends from Bad Tölz to do the same. The two brothers, George Seidl and Hans Sedlmaier brought their love of dance and Bavarian customs with them to Washington, DC and so the story of "Washingtonia" began.

Michael Benedikt born in 1903 was a metal worker and married Irma Wunder. The pair had a son Frank and a daughter Josephine. In June 1967 Michael tragically passed away in an automobile accident at age 63 and was buried in Prospect Hill Cemetery in Washington, DC next to his son who passed away in 1931. A the time of his death, the couple lived in Berkeley Springs, WV.

Lorenz Benedikt, born in 1905, worked at the U.S. Senate as an upholsterer and even crafted a corset for Robert Kennedy. He was a long-time footballer, and a member of the Bavarian Sports Club. Dance practice evenings were held at his summer home in Woodland Beach, MD. Lenz married Julia and the

pair lived in Washington, DC. Due to Lenz's pioneering work in building Washingtonia, he became honorary president of the association in 1959. After his retirement he retreated to his little house in Woodland Beach, where he lived with his wife until he moved to the Friends Nursing Home in Sandy Spring, Maryland. In October, 1989 at the age of 84 Lenz passed away after a long illness.

In the 1980s it was part of the "Washingtonia" tradition to dance for Lenz and other guests for his birthday on June 10th. During the 1986 birthday dance, Lenz's stepson, Joseph M. Turner, presented a gift to Washingtonia: a painting of Lorenz Benedikt from 1922. The club would fondly remember that, even in his final year, Lenz would tap his foot to the beat of the music.

Washingtonia is fortunate to be in contact with Thomas Benedikt, a descendant of Michael and Lenz, who still lives in Bad Tölz today with his wife, Uschi, two sons and granddaughter. They are not active members of any Schuhplattler clubs, but they still live the authentic Bavarian lifestyle.

Thomas was only a small boy, when his great uncles visited the family in 1965. The pair of brothers only found the opportunity to visit their Heimat two or three times. Thomas fondly remembers that Lenz and Michael continued to speak in their Bavarian dialect.









## Celebrating 100 Years of G.u.G.E.D. "Washingtonia"

Founders: George & Katherine Seidl



George Seidl was born on August 12, 1902 in Bad Tölz, Bavaria. His wife, Katherine Seidl was born on May 8th, 1901. When his friend Michael Benedikt emigrated to America in 1922, he shortly afterwards brought his friends George Seidl, Lorenz Benedikt and Hans Sedlmaier to this continent. Katherine joined her husband to start a new life in Washington, DC. It was then that four young "Buam aus Bayern", familiar with folk customs and traditional dance from their homeland, founded S.u.G.T.V. Washingtonia.

Shortly after immigrating, George began working as a bricklayer in Washington; At that time, he was approached by a local doctor who asked him to renovate a country home in Wheaton, MD. This was the start of his career as a building contractor. Later, in 1956, he founded the construction company George Seidl & Sons, Inc., where he served as president until his death.


George and Katherine Seidl, were also active members of the Washington Sängerbund throughout their lives. As a member of the Committee

of Eleven, George participated in the 1948 purchase of the Concord Clubhouse at 2434 Wisconsin Avenue NW in Georgetown. He also served as an honorary member of the Board of Directors of the German Orphan Home.

The pair had a son George L. F. Seidl and a daughter Catherine. They were also fortunate to have 5 grandchildren: Nancy Catlett, Catherine Catlett, Frances Seidl, Barbara Seidl and George M. Seidl. and 8 great grandchildren: Lauren Gamble, Alissa Aronstam, Jacklyn Gamble, William Magill, Steven Gamble, Callan Seidl, Jacob BarHaim and Hailey BarHaim.

Both lived to celebrate their 90th birthdays and George was the longest living founder. Washingtonia celebrated George's 90th birthday in the Concord Clubhouse. On this special occasion, the club presented George with several gifts including a photograph from 1923 with him, and Washingtonia co-founders. Katherine passed away shortly after her 90th birthday on July 28, 1991 and on March 10, 1994 George Seidl died at his home in Bethesda, MD, at the age of 91.

George and Katherine, who used to take part in all important German-American events and festivals, will remain unforgettable. In his neat traditional suit, George was always a living example of Bavarian customs in America, often traveling to Bad Tölz to "see what was going on in Bavaria..."
